
To support children's development with regard to displaying our key values, the following sets out clear, age-appropriate, expectations which relate to how children can demonstrate our six key values.



I can be polite and helpful.	I can put resources away carefully.	I can see when someone else is being kind.			



		I try to make other people feel good by my kind actions.			



	I can work productively in a group and work effectively towards achieving a shared goal.				



I look after my belongings and those of other people.	I can talk about the things I am already doing to help me with my learning.				


