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	Library Software – Mrs Burton  The former library software no longer works and therefore books are being lost as only a written record of who has each book is being used. Cost approx. £2000 plus ongoing annual subscriptions but £600 has been set aside by the school and additional money could be taken from this years school budget. The PTA committee await a formal funding request before considering the request. YO also offered to look into alternative software some of which is available free of charge.	YO
	Introducing block play for Foundation Stage - £2000 This has been very successful at Brunswick nursery and introducing this to foundation stage has been proposed. The request was viewed favourably and we aware more specific details	МС
4. Outdoor environment	The proposed designs for revamped KS1 and 2 playgrounds by Sovereign and Mant were reviewed. Sovereign's design featured a pirate ship at a cost of £20,000 and a climbing frame with rope bridge, slide etc for £50,000. For the KS2 playground they had proposed a climbing frame with an enclosed slide, tower and trim trail for £49,000. These costs including installation and appropriate surfacing.  Further baseline work would cost £1600 with a detailed design costing £3000.  Obtaining another quote from a company such as Wicksteed was suggested.	MC
	Pods Some woodworkers came to look at the pods with a view to replacing them as a recreational project in their spare time. It was found that event the posts which appeared intact were infact rotten. The wooden posts are covered with around 6 inches of soil before going into concrete which was a poor design. However this means that they would be relatively easy to remove. Proposal of removing the pod in the worst condition to allow the woodworkers to install a new design as a prototype. The idea of simply removing the pods in the short term was discussed as was the idea of speaking to Coulsons about any help that they could offer as they are already in contact with the school regarding painting the hoarding of the library site.
